### Hosea 10:9-15

#### What Happened at Gibeah?

(Verses 9-10; Judges 19-20)

The twelve tribes of Israel *almost* \_\_\_\_\_ eleven, and the story is about to be \_\_\_\_\_.

#### What's Happening in Israel?

1. Gibeah-like \_\_\_\_\_ continues to be planted.  
(Verse 13)

2. Like Gibeah, Israel will now reap \_\_\_\_\_.  
(Verses 11, 14-15)

**THE INVITATION** → “\_\_\_\_\_ your unplowed ground.”  
(Verse 12)

#### Planting Righteousness Today

## When History Repeats Itself

### Hosea 10:9-15

#### What Happened at Gibeah?

(Verses 9-10; Judges 19-20)

The twelve tribes of Israel *almost* **BECAME** eleven, and the story is about to be **REPEATED**.

#### What's Happening in Israel?

1. Gibeah-like **WICKEDNESS** continues to be planted.  
(Verse 13)

2. Like Gibeah, Israel will now reap **DEVASTATION**.  
(Verses 11, 14-15)

**THE INVITATION** → “**BREAK UP** your unplowed ground.”  
(Verse 12)

#### Planting Righteousness Today

1. Make a committed decision to **BREAK UP** any **HARDENED** ground in your heart.

**REMEMBER** → Breaking up unplowed ground is **HARD** work, but it's **NECESSARY** for good soil.

2. Continually **PLANT** the gospel into your **HEART** and **MIND**.

**REMEMBER** → Even good soil won't **PRODUCE** anything if you aren't **PLANTING** anything.

3. Be careful not to fall into the trap of **LEGALISM**.

**REMEMBER** → Legalism says, “**I AM** righteous;” faith says, “**JESUS** is my righteousness.”
