Why Good Times Can Be Misleading

Hosea 9:1-9

A False Sense of Security and Prosperity

(Verse 1)

NOTICE \rightarrow All seems to be WELL in Israel, but the main **PROBLEM** is still present.

The Exodus Reversed

(Verses 2-9)

- 1. God's people will **RETURN** to **EGYPT**.
- 2. Future **FESTIVALS** will be like **FUNERALS**.
- 3. **ABUNDANCE** will turn into **BARRENNESS**.

THE POINT \rightarrow Even though God's heart is broken, he doesn't **OVERLOOK** his people's **SIN**.

Seeing the Big Picture of Grace

- 1. The **PATIENT** Watchman.
- 2. The LOVING Redeemer.

Listening to the Watchman Today

1. Just because all is well on the **OUTSIDE** doesn't mean all is well on the **INSIDE**.

REMEMBER → One of the healthiest **PRACTICES** a Christian can have is frequent **SELF-SEARCHING**.

2. You can avoid a lot of **PAIN** in life if you **SOFTEN** your heart to God's **WORD**.

REMEMBER → Repentance isn't a **ONE-TIME** thing.

3. The God who doesn't **OVERLOOK** sin is the same God who **FORGIVES** sin.

REMEMBER → No matter how far you might have **DRIFTED**, Jesus will *always* **WELCOME** you home.
